We also got a tour of the Red Hill Mine where the second largest nugget was found.

On Thursday and Friday, the 3 classes attended 3 different costume schools, Wesleyan School, Red Hill School and the Ragged School. We all dressed up in costumes which were just like the clothes they wore in the 1850s. We watched a demonstration of how the delicious raspberry drops were made. We were also shown how gold is smelted into gold bars. Our evenings were loaded with events such as the Aura Sound and Light Show and a pantomime. After all this we returned to our cabins to relax.

Year 6 camp was the best camp I've been on. I loved learning about how children in the 1850s lived, wearing the costumes (even if they were roasting to walk around in) and exploring the streets of Govereign Hill. We all had a great time!


