2025 Enrolments are Now Open

Spacetalk Watches and Mobile Phones at School

A reminder to parents that the Department of Education has a mobile phone ban in place that requires students who bring mobile phones to school to have them switched off and handed to their teachers for safe keeping during school hours. The department requires all schools to ensure this ban is in place and enforced from the start of the 2024 school year. The ban applies equally to all government schools right across the state. This helps ensure that school is a learning environment free from unnecessary distractions and disruptions. Spacetalk and smart watches are a part of this statewide ban and are not to be worn at school, regardless of what mode they are in. If your child needs the watch for after school, it should be handed in to the teacher in the morning before school.

If your child needs an exemption from this policy due to medical or safety reasons, can you please contact me in writing. I ask for the support of all our families, staff and students in continuing to support the implementation of this policy in our school. The full policy is available on our website.




day. Well done NGPS KIDS!!




