

They even got to visit the official Eureka flag that was flown over the battle of the Eureka Stockade. After that extraordinary experience students later ventured out to the one and only Sovereign Hill. On arrival students, teachers and parents walked down to the park to eat lunch. Not too long after they all panned for gold in a small creek nearby. Once night fell everyone visited the AURA sound and light show. It first began with a short movie about the beginning of gold. 

Bus Route Changes starting Term 2 2024 due to Roadworks - Hamilton Rd New Gisborne




