School Council Elections

School Council Elections

All government schools in Victoria have a School Council, a legally formed body that is given the power to set the key directions of a school within centrally approved guidelines. A School Council, therefore, is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students. Three possible categories of membership exist - parent, Department of Education & Training employee and optional community member category. The term of office for members is usually two years. Half the members must retire each year and this creates vacancies at the annual School Council Elections. Parents on School Council provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of a school. You don't need any special experience to be on a School Council. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

This year, 2024, the following vacancies exist:

Parent Member Category - Four (4) Vacancies DET Member Category - One (1) Vacancy

A notice and call for nominations for the above vacant positions has been placed on display in the office area. Nomination forms are available **from the school office**. Interested parents are able to **'self-nominate'**. You have **until 4:00pm on Monday 4th March**, to get your nominations in to me. If, at this time, I don't have enough nominations I can allow an additional three days for more nominations. If I then have equal, or less, nominations than the number of vacancies, these people are elected automatically. If I have more nominations than vacancies, a ballot of the school community will be necessary.

If you have an interest in how the school runs, and a desire to take on a more active role, please consider nominating. School Council meets about 8 times each year. Meetings are generally on a Tuesday night, starting at 7:00pm and finishing around 8.30pm.


Term 1 – February 2024!

Big Art:

February's Big Art challenges have allowed children to showcase their creativity and individuality every Friday. Children have been able to explore different forms of painting such as abstract, collages, and geometric artworks that allowed for each child's unique abilities and creativity to shine. Children were able to explore art using items other than a paint brush to create these art works, including masking tape, a ruler and markers.
